KNOW WHO YOU ARE AND WHOSE YOU ARE

It is [God] who made us, and we are his. ~ Psalm 100:3

In a society of confusion and compromise, see to it that your life is clearly defined: know who you are and to whom you belong. Have a non-negotiable allegiance to principle and to God. That will make life simple for you—not easy, but simple. In a world of distracted identity, muddled commitment, and foggy focus, be clear-eyed and destination-directed. Maintain rock-solid, uncompromised convictions.

Your life will then be exemplary and worthy of imitation, not only in your brief sojourn here but also in the lives of those you love after you're gone. They won't be without you: the abiding eloquence of your example will continue to be a guiding light that will permit them to walk without stumbling, even in their darkest hours.

HOW TO BECOME A CHRISTIAN

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, died for us and rose from the dead, making salvation available as a gift (John 3:16; Romans 6:23). In order to benefit from this great sacrificial love, one must receive God's grace through faith in Christ and obedience to him (Romans 5:1-2; Hebrews 5:9). To become a Christian, the Bible teaches that we must believe in and put our trust in Christ (John 8:24), turn away from a life of sin (Luke 13:3), confess Jesus as Lord (Romans 10:9-10), and be baptized for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16). Main Text: (Romans 1:13-17)

Supporting Text:

- (Romans 15:17) I have therefore whereof I may glory through Jesus Christ in those things which pertain to God.
- (Romans 15:20) Yea, so have I strived to preach the gospel, not where Christ was named, lest I should build upon another man's foundation:
- (1 Peter 1:18) Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; (19) But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:
- (1 Corinthians 9:21) To them that are without law, as without law, (being not without law to God, but under the law to Christ,) that I might gain them that are without law. (22) To the weak became I as weak, that I might gain the weak: I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some. (23) And this I do for the gospel's sake, that I might be partaker thereof with you.
- (**Hebrews 2:11**) For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren,
- (1 Corinthians 1:18) For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God.
- (**Deuteronomy 7:7**) The Lord did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people; for ye were the fewest of all people:
- (2 Corinthians 5:21) For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.
- (Habakkuk 2:4) Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his faith.
- (Habakkuk 3:16) When I heard, my belly trembled; my lips quivered at the voice: rottenness entered into my bones, and I trembled in myself, that I might rest in the day of trouble: when he cometh up unto the people, he will invade them with his troops. (17) Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls: (18) Yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation.
